Mark: Hey it's Mark Podolsky the Land Geek with your favorite niche-y real estate website www.TheLandGeek.com. We've got the Zen Master - Mike Zaino, the Technician - Erik Peterson. We've got Jeannie. Jeannie, we've got to give you a nickname. What's your nickname Jeannie?

Jeannie: I don't know. We've got to figure one out.

Mark: I know what it is, it's 'Good God Great Sex' Jeannie Morem here on the podcast.

Scott: I'm just going to be Simon Cowell and Tate is Paula Abdul, just saying.

Mark: Wow. First of all, Tate doesn't even know who Paula Abdul is.

Scott: He's googling it right now.

Mike: Paula Abdul.

Tate: Is that spelled B?

Scott: Never heard of this girl.

Mike: I think the reason why we're kind of doing it or we did it is just kind of shake it up, get new energy before the fall because it is school and I know that's kind of part of the thing we are talking about today is the back to the basics, right? We're talking about land investing and basic so you know we're trying to just reset things with a Nite Cap and that's our way of getting you know.

Just like kids are going back to school right now and they need to reset themselves from that summer energy over to that fall energy. So yeah, just kind of shake things up and get ready for a transition. I always love it like I'm in my yard right now that's why I got the tapestry behind me because I'm outside and it's like I could feel fall in the air, right? I could smell the pumpkin lattes, the pumpkin beer. It's all coming. So this is New England in the fall. But anyway it's a good change of energy, right? I think we talked about what a few weeks ago the August Iull and how sometimes that can be tough. But here we are rolling into the fall. So I'm excited.

Mark: Yeah I mean it broke 106 the other day here and it felt just like fall.

Mike: My God guy it's like a brick wall.

Jeannie: Mark is right. It did.

Mike: Why can't I hear him talking? It's all the heat in the middle like you can't even hear people talk to each other.

Mark: Yeah I mean I only had to take two showers yesterday instead of three and it just feels like fall here. Right, Jeannie?

Jeannie: It's under 100 today.

Mark: It's under 100.

Mark: Yeah. I mean we're all wearing long sleeves. The leaves aren't dying now.

Mike: Look at it they are all falling around me right now.

Mark: Yeah.

Mike: You know what that means? It's time to get wooden sword out.

Mark: Before I go into a deep seasonal depression let's segway into back to basics like back to school. So I'm just going to ask the panel as we go through our topic when you think of back to basics in the land business what's the first thing you think of? Bear Land - Aaron I'm like McLaughlin group.

Aaron: Mailing and marketing.

Mark: Mailing and marketing.

Aaron: That's the basic basics.

Mark: The basic basics. Breathe in the mailing breathe out the marketing.

Mike: Appreciate the breath.

Mark: Yeah, yeah. Mimi besides mailing and marketing what do you think of when you could think of basics?

Mimi: I think it's really easy to get distracted by the current fire. Oh I told so and so I'd get their note paperwork out by yesterday, right? So for me, it's reinforcing what I intend my schedule to be so that I keep the distractions in the minimum and still making forward progress on biggest goals. Of course, mailing and marketing is always my biggest priority. But once that's out of the way then what do I do next? Well I'm I working on an automation project, right? Don't let these other little fires get in my way. Stay focused on what my weekly schedule is.

Mark: I love that. So, Mimi, do you plan your next day the day before or do you do it in the morning?

Mimi: I do it in the morning.

Mark: You do it in the morning?

Mimi: Yeah. You know I don't use a fancy app. I just have a book and it's got my top priorities and the calls and emails I have to make. So I just kind of organize my day before I get started. Why are you laughing at me for Erik?

Erik: I'm laughing at Mark. Look at him he's like, "A book? What's that?"

Mark: A book?

Jeannie: Yeah. It's what I showed you last time. I have all these books. So yeah I get organized with it that way.

Mark: Did you find it in like a museum? Like where do they sell these things?

Mimi: Now that I don't wear a suit every day everything is Lily Pulitzer. It has all these colors and crazy patterns. I'm having such a good time. All my suits are sitting up there gathering dust.

Mark: You know I haze but I'm really enjoying my Rocketbook. So I think there's something about pen to paper.

Mike: The Blues Clues book.

Mark: The Blues Clues book? All right Mike Zaino when you think of back to basics...

Mark: I'm skipping you, Mike. Erik, what do you think of when you think of back to basics?

Erik: I think of county research that's where it all starts. So when I think a basics that's what comes to mind.

Mark: Yeah, I was thinking that as well not to steal your thunder. Go-Giver - Jeannie Morem what do you think of when you think back to basics?

Jeannie: Well I agree with everybody. But for me, I have to create momentum. So I listen to motivational speakers in the morning. For example Ed Mytell I don't know if you've ever heard his podcast but he's like a Tony Robbins. He is good and I wanted to bring him up because Mark I think if you've never heard him I think you would really like him because he talks about in business that exposure is more important than knowledge. That goes back to what you keep talking to us about marketing and mailing and mailing it's about volume. So you can educate yourself on Land Geek all you want but it's about mailing and marketing you know and that was pretty powerful. So I like to listen to motivational speakers as I'm getting ready to do mailing or marketing because it keeps me motivated especially all the crisis I've had to go through this year. I've got to keep up. I've got to stay positive. Mark: I love it. So his name is Ed Hytell?

Jeannie: Mytell.

Mark: Mitell, M-I-T-E-L-L?

Jeannie: M-Y-T-E-L-L and this man net worth is like 40 million and he came out of nowhere in the last year doing this podcast. He's like a Tony Robbins but he communicates in a different way that if you don't grasp it with Tony you can really get it with Ed. He has so much information you're going to only want to listen to like 15 minutes at a time because it's a lot to digest.

Mark: Oh wait is it Ed Mylett?

Jeannie: No, it's M-Y-T-E-L-L.

Mark: I just Googled him and Ed Mylett came up.

Jeannie: Oh okay maybe it is. Okay, sorry about that.

Mark: Okay, millionaire mindset what everyone struggling needs right now, broke to 400 million?

Jeannie: You're right. I just saw it yeah its Mylett sorry about that.

Mark: Nice. Okay, Ed Mylett I will check him out. Mike Zaino, what do you think about when you go to basics, get back to basics? Oh, you're on mute. Here we go.

Mike: Oh you can maybe take it back to school and I think Flight School I think the professor down the diagonal to me it's Scott Todd I think that you know everybody is going back to school. We have this Flight School starting in September. I think that Scott Todd and Flight School because it is the fundamentals, right. It's the basics about how to really get up and running. I always tell people it's like college level one on one land investing thing how to be an effective land investor. So he's like the professor. It's a compliment. He's looking at me like I'm saying something wrong. That's a compliment.

Scott: I'm just thinking of the professor from the *Gilligan's Island* man. I don't know.

Mike: Mary Ann, no, no.

Mark: Maybe we should change his nickname from The Brain to The Professor

Mike: Well he is like a college professor. This is one on one. This is land investing one on one. This is how you become an effective land investor. This is how you go through Scott Todd's college course in land investing Flight School.

Scott: Flight School, all right.

Mark: Alright. Tate Litchfield, what do you think about it?

Tate: I'm going agree with Erik on this one and go county research. You know you mess that up you're going to be in ... You're going to stunt your growth and your opportunity to progress. So I agree with Erik on that one and then obviously the M and M's you can't go wrong there. That's the basics for me and then just doing it, staying organized.

Mark: Yeah absolutely. Go ahead, Mimi.

Mimi: I think that that's very strong the county research comment because I noticed in the Flight School Office Hours, people ask me questions "Do I remail if I don't do well in an area?" I think there's a perception that once you figure out what your offer is going to be then it will always be that way, right? But the markets change.

My first market I started out I would get deals for \$2000 dollars and now I'm having people wholesalers who want buy my property for \$6000. Those are just original offer letters coming from three times the price. So in two years, the price that I would offer has changed significantly. So I think county research is very important because the market is going to change.

Mark: Yeah, go ahead Bear Land - Aaron.

Aaron: [silent]

Mark: Oh, you're on mute. Go ahead.

Aaron: Another way to get back to basics especially for folks out there listening is if you have access to all those mastermind calls start listening to those. Go through them. Skip parts that you know well and really review some of the answers or some of the suggestions on some of these easier topics that they go into the basics and get different perspectives on that. That's a great way to get back to your basics.

Mark: Yeah. I think that's great. Scott Todd besides what we just discussed what's your take?

Scott: I would just say that the difference is that the thing you want to focus on is I mean we talked about the basics everything is really about just taking action, right? That's really the basic is just taking action. Because it's so easy to like say well I just need more education. I mean as a human if you ever feel like you know all about the topic well then you better watch out because you're about to get slapped by the great wall because you don't know everything about every single topic. It's always a new learning process.

The other thing is if you're not if running into new obstacles then you're not like expanding you're not growing enough, right? Because there's no way that you should know everything about every aspect of what you're doing. You're never a complete expert and if so like I said you're either like stagnant or you're just not growing. But at the end of the day, we can give you all the education that you need but nothing will happen. You can have all the educational but nothing will happen nothing at all unless you take action. So you've got to execute and take action. That's really the basics for me.

Mark: Yeah, I mean it's hard to argue with those points. I think that's right. I think you taking that action and even weaving in what everybody said. Because like I think what Jeannie said really important because if you're not in a state where you can even take action because life has knocked you down in some way, right? First, you even start with just that self-care, right? Kind of waking up and getting yourself in a mindset where you're motivated first to take action then going back to that point okay what's the first right action to take? In our business that basic is going to be what county do I go to? Why am I going to a county? Then going into that county research. So I think it all sort of weaves in together and then what Bear Land - Aaron and Mimi said which is okay now you got to get your mailing out. You picked your county. Let's go back to the basics let's get our mailing out you know pricing and then we are going to start the marketing piece and doing all that.

Not getting sort of overwhelmed with the details of the business. You know as much fun as it is for us to talk about you know a Zapier integration sometimes for some people that might just be too much like go back to basics. So I think it's a really great topic and just a reminder that as we sort of go back to school like think about school, right? All of this is repetition and it's just kind of going through the basics and they add one more layer of complexity but they sort of always go through review and go through the basics and do all that. So Mike Zaino are we good on that, on the basics? I hear something in the background you guys hear that? Someone listening to the radio? What is it?

Mike: That is a wind here in New England fall.

Mark: It could be the wind. I don't know. Bear Land - Aaron are we good?

Aaron: I think we are great.

Mark: Yeah. I think it is the wind. I'm going to mute Mike. All right, I think I'm hearing noises. So we're now at the point in the podcast where we're going to ask for your tip of the week a website, a resource, a book perhaps a quote something actionable where the Art of Passive Income listeners can go improve their businesses, improve their lives. I believe it's Mike Zaino's turn. Mike? Is it not yet your turn? I can't hear you.

Mimi: That was funny. That was funny.

Mark: That was awesome.

Scott: You did pretty good though man. I was starting to buy it.

Mark: Now I'm going to start watching the video podcasts. I think we throw these up on YouTube and the Mastermind group. Mike, are you now ready for your tip of the week or is it Erik's turn?

Mike: Well I'm not going to lie it was really Erik's turn.

Mark: It's Erik's turn?

Mike: Yeah, I'm not going to lie. I can't lie. It's Erik's turn. I don't want to steal his thunder. Far be it for me.

Erik: I got you, Mike. I got you.

Mike: Thank you.

Erik: So we'll go with BuzzSumo today. BuzzSumo I think it's just BuzzSummo.com is a kind of a research tool that you can use if you're looking at developing content. Say you know you're writing blog articles about land you know trying to generate traffic to your website using a tool like BuzzSumo might help you kind of determine what to write about next.

Mark: Very good BuzzSumo, BuzzSumo.com I think that's from the AppSumo guys, Noah Kagan.

Erik: I think it is.

Mark: Yeah, phenomenal, phenomenal final tip of the week. Well, I thought this was a really short and sweet and fun podcast. Mimi, what is so funny?

Mimi: Tate, just put a link in a chat with a great new idea for how to use land. You can have a dog rescue.

Tate: It was the first thing that popped up. I've used BuzzSumo and I typed in land in the first one that comes up is "Man adopts 45 dogs and sets them free across four acres of land."

Mark: You know what I'm thinking right now, a Florida man.

Tate: Don't search it. I just did. There's some crazy ones that just came up.

Mark: Tate do you want to tell everybody the joke?

Tate: I mean I think everybody should know the joke already. It's just every time if something terrible happens it seems to happen in the state of Florida and the news articles always report it as a Florida Man.

Erik: It's not even so much that it's always terrible it's just crazy weird things.
